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This Access Management Plan is made under sections of the *Mining Act 1992*.

Failure to comply fully with the terms and requirements of this Access Management Plan is a breach of the title conditions and may provide grounds for cancellation of the relevant Opal Prospecting Licence or Mineral Claim granted by the Department of Primary Industries and/or imposition of penalties as specified under mining legislation.

**LOCATION**

This Access Management Plan covers the property Kurrajong as shown on the attached plan and provides access for titleholders and potential titleholders.

**REVIEW OF ACCESS MANAGEMENT PLAN**

A review of this plan may be sought at any time by either the Landholder or Miners Representative. This plan remains in place until any reviewed plan commences. Any review to this Access Management Plan, other than an agreed temporary amendment, should be in writing and lodged with the Director-General as an addendum to this Access Management Plan.

**TITLE CONDITIONS**

Conditions set out in the Opal Prospecting Licence, Mineral Claim or any Mines Operation Plan may not be amended by agreement between the licence/claim holder and the landholder.

**ACCESS**

Access for titleholders and potential titleholders to Opal Prospecting Blocks and areas of mineral claims will be via the roads and tracks nominated on the map unless agreed in writing with the Landholder. Access from the roads and tracks nominated on the map to a mineral claim should be by the shortest and most practicable route taking into consideration sensitive features of the area and wherever possible should be used by adjacent claim holders on a shared basis.

Keep all gates closed on all access roads at all times unless otherwise directed or requested by the landholder.

Black soil roads and tracks should not be used during or following wet weather while they are still soft.

Do not impede roads or tracks with mining equipment or mullock.

Only designated roads should be used for access to opal fields. Where routes are marked "No Access or No Access to Opal Field" there is to be no mining related traffic on these roads.

Keep driving speed around the fields to a safe, acceptable level. Excess speed puts stock, landholders and other miners at unnecessary risk.

### **MULLOCK**

Any excess mullock beyond that required for the backfilling of mine shafts must be transferred to a mullock dump.

Ensure that mullock is only dumped inside the boundaries of the dump and progressively fill it in one direction.

Mullock must not be dumped at any location other than an approved mullock dump.

Opal bearing clay stockpiled for processing must be removed at regular intervals.

### **AREA AND METHOD OF ACTIVITY**

Mining and prospecting may only be carried out in the area stipulated in the subject licence or claim, and outside areas of dwellings, gardens and improvements and other identified restricted areas as shown on the map.

**FENCES:** Claims can be pegged up to or over a fence providing there is no surface activity within 10m of all fences within the property.

**ROADS:** Claims can be pegged over roads provided there is no surface activity within 10m of the centre line of the road.

**DRAINS:** Claims can be pegged over drains provided there is no surface activity within 10m of the uphill side of drains.

Do not block off natural drainage channels running across your claim as it interferes with water flow into stock dams

Permanent camps are prohibited. Only tents and caravans are permissible.

No dogs are permitted on the property.

### **ACCESS TO WATER**

There is no access to water.
